The Last Flag Down

150th Anniversary of the Return of the CSS *Shenandoah*

LIVERPOOL, GB—SCV members, MOSB members, and Confederate Navy Reenactors from the United States and Europe descended upon Liverpool, England the first week of November 2015 to commemorate the 150th Anniversary of the return of the CSS *Shenandoah* to Liverpool. The event, known as the Last Flag Down, would commemorate the lowering of the last Confederate Flag at the end of the War for Southern Independence. On November 6, 1865, the *Shenandoah* sailed up the River Mersey to Liverpool and surrendered to British naval authorities. This event was organized by Jerry Wells of Richmond, VA, beginning in April 2011.

Last Flag Down events began on November 4, 2015, and included the European Confederate Medal of Honor Presentation to Confederate Capt. James I. Waddell of Pittsboro, NC. Capt. Waddell commanded the CSS *Shenandoah* for the entire voyage. The *Shenandoah* was the only Confederate ship to circumnavigate the globe during the War. A memorial service was held to honor the men of the *Shenandoah* and a memorial plaque was unveiled at the Alabama House in Liverpool to commemorate this event. The week ended on November 7th with a grand banquet for all those participants from Europe and the United States.

Military Order of the Stars and Bars Announces Scholarship Program

The Military Order of Stars and Bars has established a college scholarship program for genealogically proven: (1) descendants of Confederate Officers; (2) descendants of the Confederate Executive or Legislative branches of government; and (3) descendants of members of the Confederate States' legislatures, judiciary, and executive branches of government. The MOS&B annually awards the merit based scholarships to worthy individuals who meet eligibility requirements and have been judged on information submitted by the applicant.

It is time to start considering candidates for the 2016 awards. All Chapters and Societies are encouraged to submit applications of worthy individuals for these scholarships. There are certainly many possible candidates among our active membership, active membership's children, grandchildren and friends.

Each Department scholarship awarded will be in the amount of one thousand dollars (\$1,000). The number of scholarships awarded each year will be determined by the GEC. Please carefully read all the necessary information on the MOS&B national website.
