## Joseph Kanaka SCV Camp charters in Hawaii

**HONOLULU, HI**—The Joseph Kanaka Camp 2288, Sons of Confederate Veterans, has chartered in Hawaii. The camp was named for Joseph Kanaka, a crewman who served briefly on the *CSS Shenandoah* in 1865. Seamen Kanaka was a crew member of the whaling sloop *Abigail*, and joined Captain Waddell's crew after his ship was captured on May 27, 1865.

Captain Waddell Chapter Commander Byron Brady had the honor of representing SCV Army of Trans Mississippi Department Commander Johnnie Holley of Texas in presenting the camp's charter to Camp Commander Steve Brock. See more photos on Page 3.

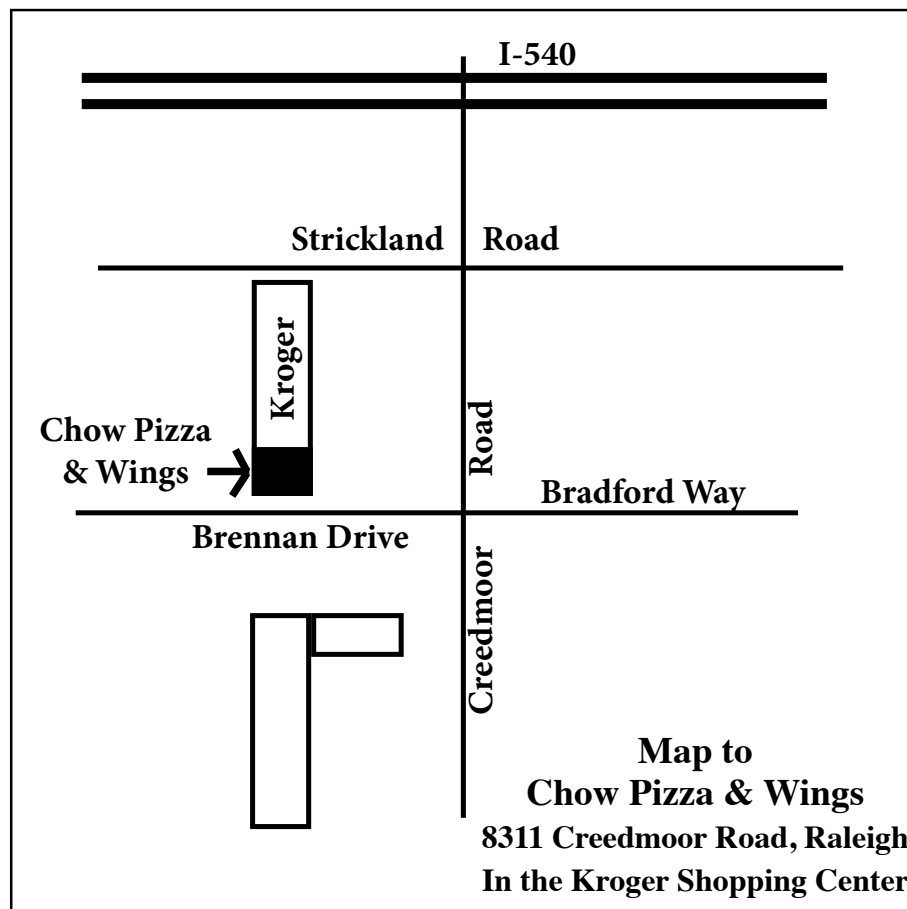

## Captain Waddell Chapter adopts new Hawaii SCV Camp

At the August 17, 2017, meeting of the Captain James I. Waddell Chapter, the membership voted to adopt the newly chartered Joseph Kanaka Camp 2288, Sons of Confederate Veterans, Honolulu, Hawaii. Joseph Kanaka joined the crew of the *CSS Shenandoah* in May 1865 while the *Shenandoah* was operating in the Pacific Ocean off the coast of Alaska.

The new camp held their charter presentation in Honolulu on August 23, 2017, at the Waikiki Prince Hotel. Commander Brady, representing SCV ATM Commander Johnnie Holley of Texas, formally presented the charter.

The Joseph Kanaka SCV Camp joins several other Confederate heritage organizations associated with Captain Waddell. Those include the *CSS Shenandoah* SCV Camp 1820, Anchorage, Alaska; the Captain James Iredell Waddell SCV Camp 1770, Orange County, CA; the Captain James I. Waddell CSA SCV Camp 1608, Annapolis, MD; and the Captain James Iredell Waddell MOSB Chapter 32, Raleigh, NC.

## MOSB revises requirements for War Service Medal

**BILOXI, MS**—The General Executive Council of the Military Order of the Stars and Bars has revised their requirements for qualification for the MOSB War Service Medal. The new requirements, proposed by Col. Gregory Eanes, USAF (Ret.), follows the same requirements established by the Veterans of Foreign Wars. The new language is as follows: *The War Service Medal is presented to an active member of the Military Order of the Stars & Bars who have served our nation honorably. Qualifying service for the War Service Medal is the same as that established by the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States. Please see the Veterans of Foreign Wars Eligibility requirements for full criteria that must be met as these are periodically updated and amended.*

Applications must be approved by the MOS&B War Service Committee. The cost of these medals is \$70.00 for each award. This cost includes a large and miniature engraved medal.

To make a reservation, you must call the Reservations number shown above, identify yourself as a member of the MOS&B group, designate the date of arrival and date of departure, make any special room requests at time of making the reservation and either give the reservationist a valid credit card number or mail an amount equal to the first night's room and tax for each room reservation. Unless you notify the front desk before checking in that you are departing before the date of departure given when making the reservation, you will be charged with an amount equal to the first night's room and tax for each room reservation.

**PARKING.** Valet parking, 24-hour in and out, is \$20.00 per 24-hour period + 14% tax. There is also a self-park and lock open lot (no fence) on the north side of the hotel. This lot operates independent of the hotel.
