The ceremony will begin at 6:00 PM with doors opening at 5:00 PM. The 2019 keynote speaker will be SCV Chaplain-in-Chief Dr. Rev. W. Herman White of High Point. Rev. White also serves as NC Division SCV Chaplain.

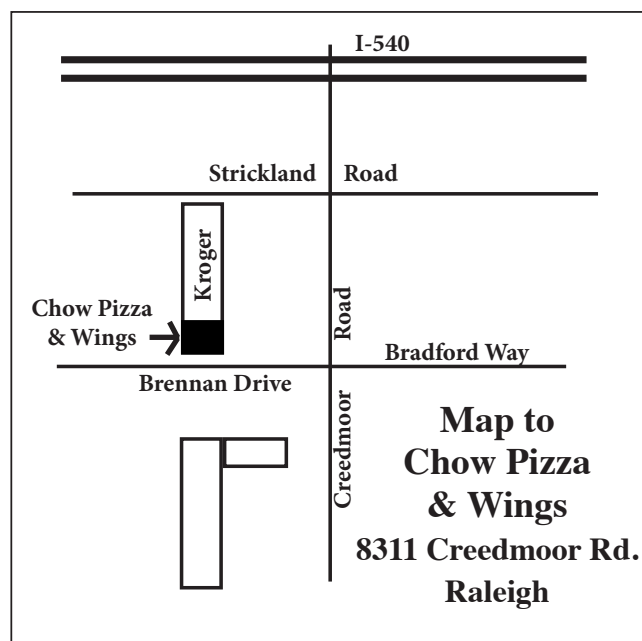
Commander Brady then presented the program on *The Dalhgren Affair*.

The motto is represented by officers crossed swords for honor and duty, iron cross for valor, and the 1st Confederate National Flag's canton with a circle of stars for protection and equality.

The first organizational meeting was held on July 13, 2018, at the Hilton Baton Rouge Capitol Center, Baton Rouge. The meeting was sponsored by the Confederate Officers of North Carolina Society MOS&B and held in conjunction with the 2018 MOS&B Baton Rouge National Convention.
