New Business: There was no new business.

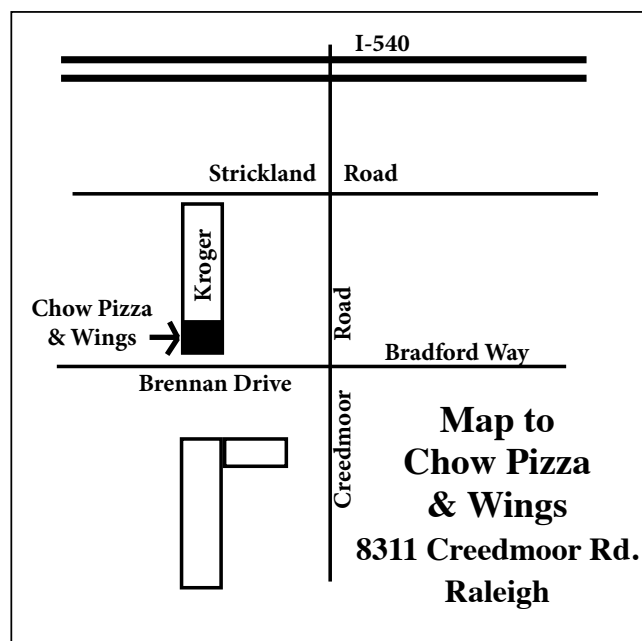
Lieutenant Commander Gary Hall introduced Jake Sullivan of Raleigh, who presented the program on *Preston Brooks*.
