Brady and Smith elected by the Order in Baton Rouge

BATON ROUGE, LA—Byron E. Brady, Commander of the Captain James I. Waddell Chapter 32, Raleigh, was elected Commander General of the Military Order of the Stars and Bars at their 81st General Convention held in the Old State Capitol in Baton Rouge on July 13, 2018. MOS&B Adjutant General **Joseph Judson Smith, III**, of Alexandria, VA, was elected Lieutenant Commander General. Both officers were sworn in during the Commander General's Banquet held the next night. The Waddell Chapter is now tied with the General Douglas Cooper Chapter in Oklahoma City with three members of each chapter having a member elected to the Order's highest office.

In the ANV Department elections, **David Stringfellow** on Virginia was re-elected Commander and **Larry Brown** of Greensboro was re-elected Department Councilor.

The Waddell Chapter scrapbook won their first ever Chapter Scrapbook award and the North Carolina Society also won the best Society Scrapbook award. Current Judge Advocate General **Tarry Beasley, II** of Florida was awarded the Robert E. Lee Chalice.

The Daughters of the CSA Officer's Corp was formed during the convention and full information on this new organization is listed on Page 5.

The 2019 MOS&B National Convention is scheduled for Waco, Texas, on July 25-27, 2019.

New Business: There was no new business.

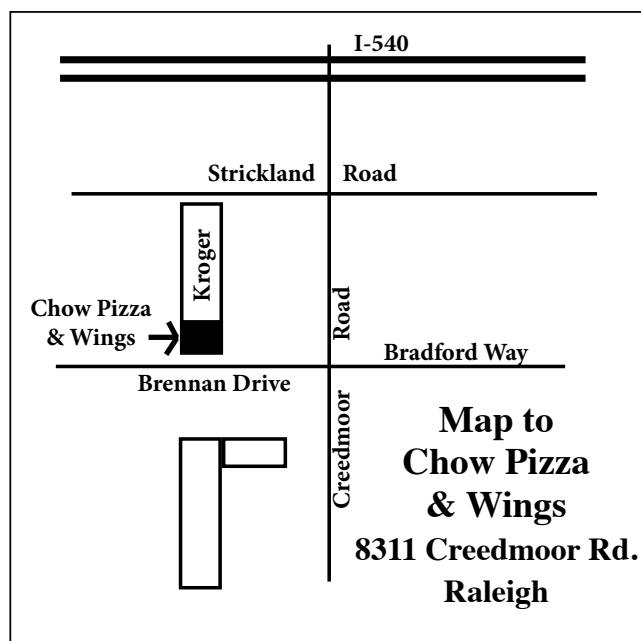
Lieutenant Commander Gary Hall introduced Jake Sullivan of Raleigh, who presented the program on *Preston Brooks*.

Daughters of CSA Officer's Corps Duty and Honor, Valor, Protection and Equality

The Daughters of CSA Officer's Corps is an organization for ladies with an ancestor who served as an officer in the military or as an elected or appointed government official of the Confederate States of America from 1861 to 1865. Ladies can become members by submitting lineage proving relationship to an officer, elected or appointed official. The motto is "Duty and Honor, Valor, Protection and Equality".

The motto is represented by officers crossed swords for honor and duty, iron cross for valor, and the 1st Confederate National Flag's canton with a circle of stars for protection and equality.

The first organizational meeting was held on July 13, 2018, at the Hilton Baton Rouge Capitol Center, Baton Rouge. The meeting was sponsored by the Confederate Officers of North Carolina Society MOS&B and held in conjunction with the 2018 MOS&B Baton Rouge National Convention.
